

Beverley Beck

Beverley Beck runs from Grovehill Lock on the River Hull at Beverley west for about 0.8 miles into the town of Beverley. Originally built to allow barges to trade into the heart of Beverley carrying a variety of goods including coal, bricks and wool, the canal also served a thriving tannery and was the original home for shipbuilding – an industry which was a feature of Beverley from the late 18th Century until the 1950s. The canal is popular for a variety of activities, including walking and angling, and is home to the Beverley Beck Boating Association, and the Beverley Barge Preservation Society.
